

MODERNS DEPARTMENT

FSF1D

French, Grade 9, Academic

This course emphasizes the further development of oral communication, reading, and writing skills. Students will build on and apply their knowledge of French while exploring a variety of themes, such as self, the environment, and films. Thematic readings will serve as stepping stones to oral and written activities.

FSF1P

French, Grade 9, Applied

This course emphasizes the further development of oral communication, reading and writing skills. Students will build on and apply their knowledge of French while exploring a variety of themes, such as self, the media and francophone culture. These themes will be the basis for short written and oral projects.

FSF2D

French, Grade 10, Academic

This course emphasizes the concurrent development of oral communication, reading, and writing skills using a broad-based theme such as the media. Students enhance their ability to understand and speak French through conversations, discussions, and presentations. They also read short stories, articles, poems, and songs and write brief descriptions, dialogues, and invitations.

Prerequisite: FSF1D

FSF2P

French, Grade 10, Applied

This course emphasizes the further development of oral communication, reading and writing skills. Students will expand their knowledge of French by studying a series of theme-related topics, such as sports, arts and inventions.

Prerequisite: FSF1P or FSF1D

FSF3U

Core French, Grade 11, University Preparation

This course draws on a variety of themes to promote extensive development of reading and writing skills and to reinforce oral communication skills. Students will gain a greater understanding of French-speaking cultures in Canada and around the world through their reading of a variety of materials, including a short novel or a play. Students will produce various written assignments, including a formal essay. The use of correct grammar and appropriate language conventions in both spoken and written French will be emphasized throughout the course.

Prerequisite: Core French, Grade 10, Academic

FSF4U

Core French, Grade 12, University Preparation

This course draws on a variety of themes to promote extensive development of French-language skills. Students will consolidate their oral skills as they discuss literature, culture, and current issues. They will read a variety of texts and will write a formal essay. The use of correct grammar and appropriate language conventions in both spoken and written French will be emphasized throughout the course.

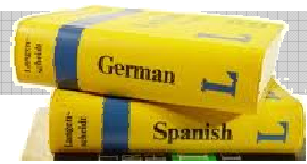

FSF30

Core French, Grade 11, Open

This course draws on a broad theme, such as leisure activities, to develop oral communication, reading, and writing skills. Students will give presentations, read a selection of short stories and articles, and produce a variety of written assignments. The use of correct grammar and appropriate language conventions in both spoken and written French will be emphasized throughout the course.

Prerequisite: Core French, Grade 10, Academic or Applied



GERMAN

LWGBD

German, Grade 10, Academic Level

This course is designed to enable students to begin to communicate with native speakers of German. Students will use simple language and read age and language appropriate passages for various purposes. They will explore aspects of the culture of countries where German is spoken, including social customs and the arts, by participating in cultural events and activities involving both print and technological resources.

LWGCU

German, Grade 11, University Preparation

This course builds on skills learned in Grade 10 German. Students will use language and read age and language appropriate passages for various purposes. They will explore aspects of the culture of countries where German is spoken, including social customs and the arts, by participating in cultural events and activities involving both print and technological resources.

Prerequisite: LWGBD

LWGDU

German, Grade 12, University Preparation

This course prepares students for university studies in German. Students will enhance their ability to use German with clarity and precision, and will develop the language skills needed to engage in sustained conversations and discussions, understand and evaluate information, read diverse materials for both study and pleasure, and write clearly and effectively. Students will also have opportunities to add to their knowledge of the culture of other countries where German is spoken through the use of community resources and computer technology.

Prerequisite: LWGCU

SPANISH

LWSBD

Spanish, Grade 10

This course is designed to enable students to begin to communicate with native speakers of Spanish. Students will use simple language and read age and language appropriate passages for various purposes. They will explore aspects of the culture of countries where Spanish is spoken, including social customs and the arts, by participating in cultural events and activities involving both print and technological resources. ***An optional workbook may be purchased.***

LWSCO, Open

Spanish, Grade 11

This course provides students with opportunities to further develop their communication skills in Spanish and to increase their confidence in applying them in a variety of practical situations, including contexts related to future employment. Students will engage in a variety of activities and use resources that will allow them to use the language in various real-life situations. They will also continue to explore aspects of the culture of countries where the language is spoken, and investigate careers that require facility in the language.

Prerequisite: Spanish LWSBD

LWSCU, University Preparation

Spanish, Grade 11

This course allows students opportunities to further their knowledge of the Spanish language and to further develop an appreciation for Spanish culture through language. Students build and apply their knowledge of Spanish while exploring a variety of themes, such as art, music, traditions, and an overview of Spanish-speaking people in the world. Students also enhance their thinking skills through the critical study of literature. They continue to explore aspects of the countries where Spanish is spoken through a variety of print and technological resources.

Prerequisite: LWSBD

LWSDU, University Preparation

Spanish, Grade 12

This course prepares students for University studies in the Spanish language. Students will enhance their ability to use the language with clarity and precision and will develop the language skills needed to engage in sustained conversations and discussions, understand and evaluate information, read diverse materials for both study and pleasure, and write clearly and effectively.
